Mrs. Desatoff said this is the first year a school outside of the Kern High School District has participated in this fundraiser. They have a competition among the high schools for the high school that raises the most money. This is considered a community service project for the students.

Mr. Holtermann announced next week the NKVTC Board would be considering approval of the barber college curriculum.

Mrs. McCray gave an overview of the proposed cuts to K-12 funding. We are very fortunate in that we do not anticipate any staff layoffs. We have a healthy reserve, have growth, and with the natural attrition in the district that should help us in the upcoming school year without any layoffs or any precautionary layoffs. She stated the enrollment at this time last year was 1643 for the district with 1434 students at Wasco High and 209 students at Independence High. Last month the enrollment for the district was at 1694 with 1513 at Wasco High and 181 at Independence High. This month the enrollment for the district is 1686 with 1478 at Wasco High and 208 at Independence High.
